#### FOR DENSITY OF MIDDLE-CLASS

The Thurston MSA Region\* has been recognized as the #1 U.S. metro for the share of residents living in middle-class households, with 66% of adults falling into that category based on a 2022 Pew/Seattle Times analysis. Thurston EDC plays a key role in sustaining and building upon that success—by attracting a diverse range of businesses, championing workforce development, and helping small businesses thrive.

This federally designated region is used for statistical and economic analysis and represents the core area of population and economic activity centered around the state capital, Olympia. The MSA designation helps track regional trends in employment, housing, business growth, and more—providing a clearer picture of the area's economic health and development potential.
